Quilts! Quilts! and Wall Hangings!

Please submit your application to display a quilt or wall hanging AS SOON AS POSSIBLE!!! As of August 8, 2014 I do not have ANY quilt applications. Just a reminder, items in the show **DO NOT have to be newly made**. They can be vintage quilts or wall hangings. As long as you own the item, you may enter the item for display. Just tell us the history of the item so we can put the story on the item in the show.

The item **DOES NOT have to be completely finished** by the deadline August 30, 2014. Only the top needs to be completed for the entry photo, it can be quilted and bound later—you will still have 4 weeks to finish it!

Also we accept entries from outside the guild—so please spread the word! We would welcome entries from quilters around the area.

For an item to be judged, the person who made the quilt can be the same or different from the person that quilted the item. The person who MADE the quilt is the one that should enter the item for judging. Cash prizes are awarded!!!

Raffle Quilt Tickets

Our goal for ticket sales is \$4,000! And it's doable! Sales to date: \$940.00.

There are approximately 100 members in our guild.

Each member is asked to sell 50 tickets.

If each member sells 50 single tickets = \$5,000!

If tickets are sold in the 6 ticket packets for \$5/ each and each member sells 8 packets (48 single tickets) that \$40 each and \$4,000 total!

Remember, the Quilt Raffle and Harvest of Quilts Show are the major fundraisers for our guild and it only happens every two years!

The main purpose of this show is to let the public know about what we do and to publicize our Harvest of Quilts 2014 Show. I made my first quilt when I was in high school. I have been designing and making original quilts ever since.

I find each step of quilt making, from the beginning to the end, a real challenge. Most of my quilts are fused or have fusing in them. My work is machine quilted and nature inspired. Every day I walk in a little woods near my home with my dog George. Much of what I see there appears in my work.

I discovered hand dyeing fabric 25 years ago, and I now work almost exclusively with my own hand dyed cotton and silks that are used in my fused and pieced quilt creations. Level: Beginner to Advanced—One day—Sewing machine required

Frieda's award winning quilts have been in many magazine articles and books. She will lead you thru a series of fun exercises where you will create one-of-a-kind free form machine quilting without marking or templates. Each exercise leads you step by step in developing your own style and expertise to free motion quilting with confidence.

- Sewing machine in good working order with feed dogs that drop and an embroidery or darning foot attachment. You machine manual
- If you have them Machine Quilting needles size 11-14
- 5-6 15' square fabric sandwich, three layers light colored solid fabric, batting (preferably cotton or cotton blend), and light colored solid back.
 Already made up and safety pinned around the edges
- · scissors or snips
- · Cotton machine quilting thread
- · Decorative threads (optional)
- · Pillow to sit on, or your own office chair with adjustable height


