## QUILT LOTTO INTRO

Welcome to Dekalb County Quilters Guild new activity, Quilt Block Lotto. Each month a new block will be introduced at our regular Guild meeting. Following the directions as to size, and color choice, you may choose to make one or more blocks to bring to the next meeting. For each block you contribute your name will be put into a drawing. At the end of the evening, one lucky member will go home with all the blocks. What a fun way to get a head start on a new quilt! You might like to make one or more blocks for the guild and a few more just for you. Remember, there's no pressure. If you like the block and want to participate great. If not, no problem. Think of it as a way to learn new skills and try new things.

For February, I chose a simple, yet striking block called Striped Squares. (Instructions were shared at the January meeting, as well as on Facebook.) The block was a free download from Jordan Fabrics and uses solids or fabrics that read as solids, like grunge. I used white as the background fabric, with one a true solid and the other a fabric that reads as a solid. The block finishes at 11 inches and is constructed around a central square. For added interest it is put together in two opposite ways, one with a central square in color and one with a central square in white. It's a very easy block and goes together very quickly. I'd suggest that you make two blocks this time, one in each color way. At the February meeting we will collect the blocks and draw one lucky winner.

## MARCH QUILT LOTTO

For our next month's Quilt Lotto (March) I've chosen another idea from Jordan Fabrics. It's called the Sister's Choice Block. The great thing about this block is that it looks completely different when you arrange the colors in different ways. Also, you can use jelly roll strips, charm squares, or candies ( two and a half inch minis) for this project.

To create this block, select eight $2-1 / 2$ " matching dark squares and eight matching $2-1 / 2$ " light squares. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the reverse side of the light squares. Place a light square on top of a dark square right sides together and stitch on the drawn line. Cut a quarter inch away from the stitching. Open, press toward the dark side. Repeat to make eight half square triangles.

Using the photo to the right, lay out the half square triangles with seventeen two and a half inch squares in a five by five block. This month's block will look like this. In the next two months I'll introduce two other variations of the same block so you will end up with a beautiful table runner if you make one block for the lotto and one block for yourself.

To make things consistent let's use red, white and blue fabrics in prints or print fabrics that read as solids.


## BITS \& PIECES

## 8 at a Time Half-Square Triangle Units

This method makes 8 half-square units using 2 squares of fabric.
1.


Place (2) squares with right sides together, Draw a line diagonally corner to corner using a mechanical pencil or Frision pen.
2.


Stitch $1 / 4^{*}$ on pach side of the drawn lines.
3.


Cut the squares in both directions.
4.


Cut the squares diagonally corner to corner.

. mula for cutting the original squares so that the half-square triangles are oversized is:

Finished size $\times 2+2$

Don't care to do the math? Not a problem! Follow the cutting chart below.

To read this chart, "Finished HST" means, completely sewn into a block. Find either the finished size or trim completed HSTs to" size to determine what the cut size is for your squares.
