# **QUILT LOTTO (RE)INTRO**

Quilt Block Lotto was introduced early last year as a fun way to learn a new pattern and maybe win a whole bunch! We had one drawing before Covid restrictions hit, but we did share a few patterns. This month we are reintroducing the three blocks included in the "Sisters Choice" pattern from Jordan Fabrics. Following the directions as to size, and color choice, you may choose to make one or more blocks for the lotto. For each block you contribute your name will be put into a drawing. At the end of the evening, one lucky member will win all the blocks. What a fun way to get a head start on a new quilt! You might like to make one or more blocks for the guild and a few more just for you. For our March meeting we hope to present a plan for counting blocks for the lotto and distributing blocks to winner(s).

#### **BLOCK ONE**

Our March 2020 block was from Jordan Fabrics. It's called the Sister's Choice Block. The great thing about this block is that it looks completely different when you arrange the colors in different ways. Also, you can use jelly roll strips, charm squares, or candies (two and a half inch minis) for this project.

To create this block, select eight 2-1/2" matching dark squares and eight matching 2-1/2" light squares. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the reverse side of the light squares. Place a light square on top of a dark square right sides together and stitch on the drawn line. Cut a quarter inch away from the stitching. Open, press toward the dark side. Repeat to make eight half square triangles.

Using the photo to the right, lay out the half square triangles with seventeen two and a half inch squares in a five by five block. This month's block will look like this. In the next two blocks, I'll introduce two other variations



of the same block so you will end up with a beautiful table runner if you make one block for the lotto and one block for yourself.

To make things consistent let's use red, white and blue fabrics in prints or print fabrics that read as solids.

#### **BLOCK TWO**

For April 2020's Quilt Block Lotto, we presented another variation of the Sister's Choice Block. Remember we are using red, white and blue fabrics in prints or print fabrics that read as solids.

Although this is the same block as last month, construction-wise, it looks completely different due to the color placement.

Remember, if you make a block or two for the lotto and one for yourself, you can end up with a lovely table runner when all the variations come together. Since we're using red, white and blue, it will be perfect for any patriotic holiday or as a gift for that special vet in your life.

April's block layout is displayed to the right.



#### **BLOCK THREE**

In May 2020, we presented the third block layout from Sisters Choice. This last variation has the same nine patch center but achieves its different look by placing the remaining blocks in a different arrangement.

It can be done with either blue or red on the outside.

Save those monthly blocks for a lotto extravaganza when we meet again!!

Finally, if like me, you have made some of these blocks for the Quilt Lotto and some more for yourself, you should now have four




or five different blocks to make a table runner. You can border the blocks with the same fabric and then use the left-over squares to make a final pieced border.

A table runner can be pieced following the diagram below.

#### Pieced border:

Stitch 31-2 ½" squares into a long border. Stitch onto one long edge of the runner. Repeat for the other long edge.

Stitch 9-2 1/2" squares together. Stitch onto short side of runner. Repeat for other side.



Quilt, bind, and enjoy!
