
## **JANUARY PROGRAM**

Happy 2024! One of the items from the Programs Survey last year was an interest in block of the month and building skills. For the first half of 2024 we will have an optional Skill Builder BOM for those who want to participate. Over the 6 months (January - June) at each month's guild meeting the printed patterns for that month's blocks will be distributed along with Skill Tips and Trick Sheets for that month's blocks (we can email digital patterns for those who cannot attend). Additionally, we'll be curating YouTube videos for each month's skills highlighting different ways to do each month's skill and sending out the links to those videos via email.

This can be as scrappy as you want, a perfect opportunity to "shop your stash"! As we go along there will be options to swap out blocks so the end result will be your own one of a kind. The finished quilt as designed will be 54 x 64. Here are some of the skills we'll be learning or sharpening: Half-Square Triangles, Economy Block, Curves, Strip Set Piecing, Quarter Square Triangles, Improv Piecing, Foundation Paper Piecing.

At January's meeting we'll have the first month's block patterns and tip sheets and then in February participants can share their blocks and get the second installment. Hopefully, a number of members will have their finished quilts to show in October.

I took the unsold smaller items back to Joni at The Enchanted Valley Farm. She had two shows in early December. The Small Businesses sale and The Genoa Christmas Craft Walk. I'm very pleased to say that The Enchanted Valley Farm sold another \$112. YAY!!! So, to add it all up: The Enchanted Valley Farm's first sale: \$63, our booth at The Wonderful World of Christmas: \$158, and The Enchanted Valley Farm's second sale: \$112...thus a total of \$313! I really do think this effort was very beneficial for us—not just the money but the exposure to the public.

Our next sale will probably be in the spring. I'm looking into the Kishwaukee Art League's art show the first week of June. The Country Store Thrift Shop recently received a large donation of fabric. The fabric is quilt shop quality. Much of it was originally purchased locally at Basketcases Unlimited and Stitching on State. The fabric will be available for sale beginning Saturday, January 20<sup>th</sup> at 8:00 am until 2:00 pm. The fabric donation did not include 30's fabrics or batiks. The snow date will be January 27<sup>th</sup>.

The Country Store is run exclusively by volunteers. The proceeds of thrift store sales are used to support Family Services with an emphasis on senior needs. This would be a great opportunity to purchase fabric and notions at reduced pricing while supporting Family Services. The Country Store does not accept debit or credit cards; they accept cash or checks only. The store cannot accept bills larger than \$20.00 or checks over \$50.00. A combination of cash and checks is perfectly acceptable.

The Country Store is located in the Junction plaza directly behind Pizza Villa.
