CHALLENGE QUILT


Red, White and ONE!

Welcome to the Red, White and ONE challenge1

In honor of the 40th Anniversary of the Dekalb County Quilters Guild, I thought it would be a fun activity to celebrate 40 years of our Guild by challenging you to come up with a small quilt for display at our 40th celebration event.

Since the 40th Anniversary is commemorated with rubies, this challenge would consist of using THREE color fabrics; Red, White and ONE other fabric. What this means is that your quilt will be predominantly Red and White with the 3rd fabric the color of your choice. The extra fabric shall not exceed 25% of the quilt top. You may use any color you choose for your ONE fabric. While it is not mandatory, I think you could challenge yourself a little more by NOT using blue but that's entirely up to you. It is YOUR quilt and you will be the one to select any design you choose, as long as it meets the size requirement.

Size of quilt shall not exceed a total outside dimension of 140" of the 4 sides, total. I know this sounds confusing, so, I will give you a couple of examples:



Quilt must be bound, and you will need to attach a 4" hanging sleeve (sewn not pinned) on the back. A label with the name of the quilt, your name and phone number shall be sewn, not pinned on the lower left corner on the BACK side of the quilt. Also, attach (with the pins provided) one of your identification cards to the lower RIGHT FRONT corner. Please cover your name and phone number with a piece of painter's tape (It will be removed after judging) and submit your quilt in a pillowcase which also must have your name, phone number and identification card on the case. Since this will be a judged event, please don't bring your quilt for Show and Tell until ATER the show. We don't want to spoil any surprises!

If you choose to participate in this activity, I will have registration forms with further instructions ready to pass out. There will be extra forms and instructions at the check in table at the next meetings.

Forms and quilts must be turned in by the September meeting to be included in the show.

Please follow the directions above and label your quilt as indicated BUT cover your name and phornumber with a piece of Painters tape* before dropping it off at the September Guild meeting. Place your quilt in a pillowcase or fabric bag which contains your name and phone number. Attach your identification tags as indicated in the following checklist.	
You will be given THREE identification cards. One to attach to your quilt. One to attach to your qubag and one for you to present when you come to collect your quilt after the show.	ıit
* Since this will be a "Viewer's Choice" challenge, names will NOT be revealed until AFTER the judging is done. This will keep all quilts judged fairly and not merely a "population contest"!	
First and Second place ribbons will be awarded.	

OK, What's next?

Below is a nandy checklist for you to follow before submitting your chantenge quilt for the snow:
Is my quilt bound?
Does my quilt meet the dimensions?
Does my quilt contain 25% or less of a third "ONE" color fabric?
Does my quilt have a hanging sleeve SEWN on the back?
Does my quilt have a label which contains my name and phone number?
Is my quilt label SEWN on the BACK lower left corner of the quilt?
Does my quilt label have a piece of Painters tape covering my label?
Does my quilt have a fabric bag or pillowcase to deliver my quilt in?
Does my quilt have its identification tag PINNED to the LOWER RIGHT FRONT of my quilt?
Does my quilt have my identification tag pinned to my fabric bag?
Will I pick up my quilt at the end of the show on Saturday?
If I'm having someone else pick up my quilt after the show? Will they sign for it?
Something to remember! You will be given a THIRD identification tag you MUST bring it when you pick up your quilt and sign for it at the end of the day on Saturday, October 26. IF you request someone else to pick up your quilt, THAT person MUST sign for your quilt.
*** PLEASE understand! IF you do not pick up your quilt after the show, you will not be getting it back until the December meeting. There is no guild meeting in November. If you want to pick up your quilt at my house afterwards, you will need to make special arrangements with me to do so. ***

Other ideas may include:


Paper piecing, the use of different tools; rulers, templates, etc. ½ square triangles, using a rotary cutter, binding, etc.



Getting to Know...Sheryl Keiler

How long have you been a guild member? Since 2016. I had just moved to Maple Park from Wheaton. I attended the quilt show that year and decided I wanted to be a part of a guild out here and this one seemed to be a good fit for me.

How long have you been sewing? I started sewing in Jr. High in Home Ec. I wasn't very good at garment making and never really pursued sewing until I had my girls when I made little sundresses and Halloween costumes for them. I found I was more in to the "crafty", home dec kind of sewing and moved into that direction. I attended a quilt show in Ft. Wayne, IN with my sister in law and loved the beautifully stitched quilts on display there. This was in the late '70's. I dabbled a bit with quilting when my girls were little but didn't truly begin my quilting journey until 2000. I had been in a serious car accident in 1999 and when I learned I needed more surgery a year later and that I would be laid up for several months after, I took my daughter to JoAnns to help me pick out project to keep me busy!





to JoAnns to pick to out a project for me to keep busy while recovering from surgery. I wanted this project to be something I could do only by hand (I had hip replacement and would be "couch bound" for several months and could not sit at a sewing machine) and would occupy my time for several months. Sooooo, we picked out a quilting book and, after thumbing through the book, found a beautiful Double Wedding Ring pattern! So, we cut out templates from file folders with scissors as well as EVERY wedge, melon and background pieces of fabric and I pieced the entire quilt by hand. With help, I "sandwiched" the layers by hand and hand quilted the entire quilt. I purchased pre-made binding and bond the quilt by hand! The whole project took me about 4 months from beginning to end. After that, I was "hooked" and decided to take a formal class and learn how to do this right! That was in 2000 and I've been addicted to this hobby ever since. When I lived in Wheaton, I taught beginners for 4 years through the Park District with the hope of carrying this time-honored hobby forward to future generations.

Favorite colors? I like all colors but if I had to pick only one, I suppose it would be blue.

Least favorite color? Again, I like all the colors, but my least favorite color would be brown. There's just too much bland and drab going on!

Favorite quilting celebrity? Alex Anderson. She shared SO much inspiration with me in her show when my quilting journey began.

What are you currently working on? HA!!!! I am currently working on several projects! Isn't that how we all roll? LOL My most pressing project right now is restoring a quilt top I "scored" at the flea market for \$10.00. It's a 1930's hand pieced quilt top. It has several pieces that are stained red and, after truing a couple of different methods to remove the stains, I have decided to replace the stained pieces. I was able to find some reproduction fabrics to add a border and binding. I am also working on the Anthology quilt that we did as a group last year as well as our Mystery quilt this year, I need to quilt my Bonnie Hunter "Old Fortune" quilt and am working on my challenge quilt. for the quilt show this Oct. I have a couple of hand piecing items I'm working on (and wonder if I will EVER finish them!) I also have several other projects lined up including embroidery and English Paper piecing!

Any other hobbies or interests? Are you kidding?! LOL, I must confess! I do but I can't give it the time that it needs and have put it aside for now. I am currently working on a Heritage scrapbook of my family tree. I have done a few scrapbooks, but this is my biggest, most important book to date. I also like to garden and hang with 3 of my Grandsons on Mondays during the school year. I have a total of 9 Grandkids whom I adore and love spending time with them. Only 2 of them are girls and hope one of them will carry on the quilting tradition.


