Either way, we will be in communication will all of you as soon as we have more information.



QUILT LOTTO

Since we haven't been able to meet since February when we did our first Quilt Block Lotto, we have decided to put a temporary hold on this project. This will give you time to catch up or make a few more if you're interested in participating! Keep in mind that we have introduced 5 more blocks since we last met:

Our March, April and May blocks (featured in the Feb-Apr newsletters) were all variations on the same block called Sister's Choice, from Jordan Fabrics. These blocks can also be put together to create a 5-block table runner.

Our June Block (May newsletter) was a free pattern from Moda Block Heads 3 by Robin Pickens called Blooming Love.

Our July block (June newsletter) was a disappearing pinwheel block:
