

DCQG Fundraising Sew-In Meeting April 27, 2017

At our April meeting we will be sewing some fun projects to help raise funds for the guild. All items made that night will be used this year in our booths such as the KVAL Art Show and Pumpkin Fest. Here are a few ideas the board has come up with.

Alzheimer's Fidget quilts or activity mats: activity mats are designed to safely stimulate and soothe people with Alzheimer's, dementia, autism, ADD, head trauma or persons recovering from strokes.. "Texture" is the key ingredient for creating this little mats. Start collecting any unusual items from your home now. Put them in a box so you can create a wonderful mat for someone.

Burrito Pillow Cases: We have all made these great pillow cases. Let's go through our stashes and collect fabrics to get more pillowcases made for fundraising. These have been a HUGH hit in our booths the last few years!

Rescue Shelter Ped Beds: These are simply squares or rectangles of scrap fabric sewn on three sides then filled with all your leftover scrapes, threads etc. So start saving all your scrap remnants and any fiber fill you want to get rid of for use in these rescue beds., which are wonderful for dogs and cats. You can find supply lists for the fidget quilts and burrito pillowcases at the end of the newsletter.

Treasurer's Report

I just wanted to take this opportunity to provide you with a brief summary of our finances.

In general, our membership dues pay for our operating expenses (rent, insurance, website, P.O. box, storage of quilt racks, etc...) and the profit from our bi-annual quilt show is what we have available to cover our programs & speakers for the following two years.

The reason we keep the reserve we have in savings is to cover our ex-

penses, in the event we do not have a quilt show, for an additional two years. Our savings account is replenished every other year following the close-out of our quilt show.

We also budget under the assumption that our workshops, retreat, holiday party and attendance at events, such as the KVAL Art Show and Pumpkin Fest, are offset by the fees we charge or the items we sell, therefore the net impact to our budget is minimal.

At each meeting I have all the detailed information regarding our finances available. Feel free to stop by and review; I will be happy to answer any questions you may have.


If you are interested in participating, we will be looking for one board member and one general member to perform our annual internal audit after the end of our fiscal year in June.

Magical Pillowcase Tutorial

Notes: the pillowcase in this tutorial uses 3 fabrics—a main fabric, a cuff/contrast fabric and a trim fabric. You can of course make the pillowcase using only 1 or 2 fabrics if you like. The assumption is that you'll be using 44/45" wide fabric.

The pillowcase pattern makes a standard pillowcase. If you'd like to make a queen or king size, fabric requirements are provided.

Fabric Requirements

1 standard size pillowcase

3/4 yd (27") main fabric

1/3 yd (12") contrast

1/8 yd trim

1 queen size pillowcase

7/8 yd main fabric

1/3 yd contrast fabric

1/8 yd trim fabric

Step 2: Cut the main fabric 32" long by 41" wide.

1 King size pillowcase1 yd main fabric1/3 yd contrast fabric1/8 yd trim fabric

Step 2: Cut the main fabric 36" long by 41" wide The entire tutorial can be found on the web at twiddletails.com/patterns/PCTute.pdf

Alzheimer's Activity Mats

Purpose-Activity mats are designed to safely stimulate and soothe people with Alzheimer's, dementia, autism, ADD, head trauma or persons recovering from strokes.

Basic Supply list-

1 piece of 12" by 17" stiff stabilizer (Timtex or Peltex Ultra Firm)

1 piece of 12" by 17" fabric for front of mat

1 piece of 13" by 18" fabric for backing

Suggestions for add ons:

Zippers, buttons, strings of beads and bells, objects to squeeze and stretch, yarn or braiding ribbons, soft toy anilmals, furry pockets, squeakers and light up objects, vinyl pocket for photos, key chains, stretch party bracelets, small glitter wands.
