**How long have you been a guild member?** I joined the Guild in March 2020. I was, at first, looking for a charitable outlet for the face masks I was making. I find that I'm enjoying the Facebook posts and Guild Newsletters a lot. We'll see if you can get my reclusive self to a meeting. ;)

**How long have you been sewing?** I have been sewing since 7th grade (1968?). My next-door neighbor took me under her wing and taught me to sew, starting with many years of garment sewing. I made the most un-flattering orange/red dress, but I could sew!



What was your first project? I made my first quilt in

approximately 1980. It had six ecru panels with animals machine

zigzagged onto the panel. I put in probably 3 layers of polyester batting. The backing and border were all one piece, with the border folding up from the back. I did miter the corners!!! While that quilt was nice, there were many subsequent disasters! At the time, I was self-taught and made many disasters/mistakes. One that comes to mind is my first big quilt, a queen size. It had oodles of half-square triangles, squares, and rectangles. I cut every piece by hand. I machine-pieced them and hand quilted it. Yikes!

Favorite colors? I love teal and jewel tones

**Least favorite color?** I hardly make anything with yellow in it. I like the color, just don't use it.

Favorite quilting celebrity? Jinny Beyer

**On what are you currently working?** I am about to finish this quilt. (right)

Any other hobbies or interests? I read a ton. I love art (visual art, sculptures). I tutor math for high school and early college students. I'd love to go to the gym again....someday. Sometimes I work as an extra on TV shows filmed in Chicago.
