Getting to Know...Sherry Mileham

How long have you been a guild member? I am not really sure of the exact day I joined DCQG. I believe it may be in the early 1990's. Several different times, I have had to forgo quilt guild due to illnesses of

family members. I just returned to be part of the guild family a couple months ago following my husband's liver transplant.

How long have you been sewing? I follow a long line of sewers and quilters. My great-grandmother hand-pieced and hand quilted many quilts. Several are now in my home with one on my bed right now. Both of my grandmothers quilted. My mother was an awesome seamstress. She made many of the dresses for my sister and me on her treadle machine. Barbie outfits were her specialty. I would sit and watch her sew. She helped me start making simple items when I was about six years old.

What was your first project? I have always enjoyed handwork. My first project was pillows for our sofa. Each pillow was pieced and then hand quilted. I did not get into more quilting until many years later when a member of DCQG urged me to come to a meeting with her.



What is your favorite color? Blue is my favorite color, but I like most every color. I love blue and yellow together. In the past, I would gravitate toward muted colors. That has changed over the years with the encouragement from a quilter friend to venture out into bolder colors!

What is your least favorite color? My least favorite color is brown, sometimes I have paired it up with aqua and like it! Who knew?

Favorite quilting celebrity? Jenny Doan is my favorite quilting celebrity quilter. She is so down to earth and personable. Her tutorials are concise and easy to follow. I also like when she shows different fabric combinations.

What are you currently working on? I have a large collection of 30's and 40's reproduction fabrics. Always have admired what Sharon Smith and Annie Berg would make from them. So, when I saw a video with Jenny Doan for the disappearing nine-patch, I started trying different blocks out. Still working on them.

Any other hobbies or interests? I enjoy embroidery, especially red work. Love to read historical novels and mysteries. One interest has also become an addiction. After going to a retreat many years ago and learning this technique, I love making fabric bowls. I have been asked to demonstrate them for many quilt shows. Will be doing so for our 2019 Quilt Show!
