Come hear how Judy was inspired to take full size quilts and miniaturize them. Judy loves the challenge and considers them to be puzzles. She will bring a large collection of her miniatures for us to view. Don't be fooled, these aren't just small quilts. They have the same number of pieces as a large quilt.

Judy Jurs is a long-time quilter and former member of the DeKalb County Quilters' Guild. If you don't remember her by name, you will remember her friendly smile. Judy works at Stitching on State and is teaching several classes this fall at SoS.

My original challenge to you was to use one of Madaline Carpenter's scrappy methods to create your placemat. But maybe you have some orphan blocks, want to try a new technique, have a panel to repurpose – go for it! We are looking for placemats to be approximately 12" x 18."

As of the August meeting, members reported 58 completed placemats and a plan to complete another 58. Meals on Wheels was thrilled to receive any number of placemats, but it would be great if we could hit our lofty goal of 150. This is a great project to bring to Sewing Saturdays. Jennifer pieced several scrappy placemats during our last sew-in.



SEPTEMBER QUILT LOTTO

For September we are sewing the Moda Block Head pattern Mosaic by Brigitte Heitland. Use any scrappy colors you like! Remember, every block you sew gets you an additional entry into the drawing. Hope you join in the fun!



2. Referring to BASIC INSTRUCTIONS stitch and flip technique make a square-in-a-square unit with the F squares and an E square. The center unit measures 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".



OCTOBER QUILT LOTTO

For October's quilt lotto block, let's make pumpkins! This block was completed at this month's Sewing Day using 2-1/2 in squares. The 16patch is then snowballed on the corners to "round out" the pumpkin. The green stem is a half square triangle that is also snowballed on the green corner. The border is completed with 2-1/2 inch strips. Use a neutral color for the background an any festive pumpkin colors for your 16-patch.

If you'd like you could also make striped pumpkins using 2-1/2 inch strips instead of 16-patches.

The final block should measure 12-1/2 inches square.
