Programs:

"Perfect Circles with Invisible Machine Applique" Theresa Kennedy (Thursday, September 28)

From Theresa: I am a lifelong needle and thread enthusiast and started my journey with garment sewing, hand embroidery and cross stitch. I caught the quilting bug in the early 90's and never looked back! I am drawn to applique quilts, especially those that combine applique with pieced blocks, and I'm also a fan of scrappy quilts too.

I have taught classes at Stitching on State for several years and since my recent retirement from my 'day job', I am now a part time staff member.

A popular class of mine is Invisible Machine Applique which gives you the look of hand appliqué by using your sewing machine. As it is a 5-hour hands on class, we can't explore all the tips and tricks at the meeting, but I thought you would like to learn how to make Perfect Circles and know how to stitch them to a background using Invisible Machine Applique. Although I will demo this process, it will also be hands on for any guild member to try.

If you want to participate in the hands-on portion of this class, please bring a sewing needle, thread, and a Frixion pen (if you have one).

NICU 4-COLOR CHALLENGE

The NICU 4 color fabric challenge is happening with the big reveal at the October meeting. There are still 4 kits left (1/2 yard of each of the 4 Kona solids) as of writing this so don't miss out. You can add other fabrics just as long as the 4 colors are featured. Finished quilts should meet the NICU size requirements (47 x 54). Looking forward to seeing what everyone does with their fabric.

BLOCK LOTTO

Since some members are working hard on their 4-color challenge quilts due in October, and we have Thanksgiving and Christmas after that, our next block lotto pattern will be shared in the October newsletter. This block was suggested by our own Dorothy Francke!

The block is a combination heart block and log cabin, is easy to construct and can make use of your leftover fabrics. Since we will be including this pattern in our October newsletter, we will collect them in January so the lucky winner can use them for a Valentine quilt!

Start going through your stash to collect heart appropriate 2-1/2" strip fabrics (we're thinking reds and pinks). You will need six different scrappy fabrics for each heart block. You will also need some background fabric. These can be the same fabric or the same color, but different prints.


