HARVEST OF QUILTS - October 25-26, 2024

Our Harvest of Quilts Show is approaching, and we are excited to highlight our fabulous quilts and give an opportunity for our members and attendees to take part in making NICU quilts. The show is also important in our efforts to raise funds through raffle quilt ticket, raffle basket ticket and boutique item sales which will be used to continue supporting our mission of promoting the fellowship and art of quilting.

Our show will feature several displays for which an entry form must be completed and submitted by October 1. This will allow time to work on the layout and determine if additional quilts are needed to "fill the pews."

- **General Display/Members' Quilts**: To display a quilt one must be a member of DCQG. These quilts will be "judged" with viewers' choice awards.
- **Special Display/Skill Builder Quilts**: These entries can be fully completed quilts, a quilt top or blocks you have made using the skill builder patterns. The idea is to showcase how the same pattern can look so different by the use of different colors/prints or by rearranging the placement of the blocks.
- **Special Display/Youth Quilts**: This category is open to young people ages 18 and younger. If you know a young person who has made a quilt or who you've taught to sew or quilt, as a member you can sponsor their quilt(s) for the youth display.

Entry forms are included with the newsletter and will be available at the meeting.
