There will be a sign-up sheet at the February meeting or as always, feel free to contact me with any questions you may have.





From Kathi Davis - Please turn in EVERYTHING you have from the 2026 raffle quilt blocks at the February meeting—even if you are not finished. It is okay if you did not get to them. We do understand good intentions that are foiled by life. We have received 37 blocks so far and need 42. However, many of the blocks received need some modifications to be able to be used in the raffle quilt. The main problem is that there is not the ½ inch (or close) between the outer point of the ribbon and the side of the block to allow for points showing when blocks are assembled. We will



work on this and assembling the quilt at a Sew-In Saturday on March 8th, 2025.

FYI: We will use any left-over blocks that are not used in the raffle quilt to make a "Carry Bag" for the raffle quilt.

In February we delivered 23 completed baby quilts to the Rockford NICU Center. Thank you to Sidneya Bennett and Joan Mommer for the transporting the quilts. We have a goal of 50 quilts before our Holiday Dinner in early December. We are almost half-way there! I will have a table at the February meeting and Sewing Saturday. At the table will be more kits, quilt labels, or collect your completed quilts. Please return any extras from your kits.

Announcing a new project: We received a large donation of fabric from Mandy Bahena in



Dekalb. Thank you, Mandy! She has requested that the fabric from her mother's stash be used to make little quilts or walker/wheelchair bags for nursing homes or people with disabilities. This project has been on my mind since so many guild members requested that the QAYG (quilt as you go) method be used for something smaller. I have been gathering resources for wheelchair/fidget quilts. The donation came at the perfect time. These are lap size and can range from a pretty quilt with a pocket or multiple fidget activities for Alzheimer's patients. I am putting

together ideas, patterns, and resources for these. This includes items from the donation; as well as some FUN fabrics in your stash – such as satins, textures, notions (zippers, etc.) - make use of the notions waiting in your stash for a 'happy purpose.' I would LOVE to share with you all the research I have done and work together to create kits, etc. Come find me at the February meeting. 
