Ways and Means, Raffle Quilt, and Publicity for Harvest of Quilts 2024

Please remember that every time you either talk about our quilt show, handout a bookmark, put up a poster, or sell a raffle ticket you are assisting with the publicity for our quilt show happening October 25th and 26th. The word-of-mouth publicity is a GREAT help towards having more attendees.

The bookmarks are in a box on the admissions table during our monthly meetings. Please take as many as you need (more can always be printed), especially if you are going to go to quilt shops (many will place in shop for their customers) or workshops or even other guilds and hand them out. Whomever uses the bookmark receives \$1 off admission into our quilt show.

We've taken the raffle quilt to Riverwalk Quilters Guild in Naperville and The Faithful Circle Quilters Guild in Downers Grove. The amount collected was \$156, very much worth the trip.

We are scheduled to take the quilt to Sinnissippi Quilt Guild in Rockford on June 6th. Jean Bradford (our Director at Large) has volunteered to go with me. Sinnissippi has two meetings on the first Thursday so we will be staying all afternoon into the evening.

After that, the next scheduled guild is County Crossroads in Forreston, IL (near Freeport) on Monday July 15th. They will be having an "Ice Cream Social." Then is Prairie Star Guild in St. Charles on both Monday evening August 26th and Tuesday morning August 27th. As of now, we

do not have any volunteers to go to these guilds. We show the raffle quilt and sell tickets at these guilds. If you are interested in assisting, please contact me as soon as possible.

About the raffle quilt named "Twinkling Stars", it is 84" X 84" and there is a photo on our website at https://dcqg.org/quilt-show-2024.html. On that page there is a link to the poster that can be printed and handed out. I will bring the quilt to the salad supper guild meeting this month. The quilt is comprised of LOTS (I have not counted) of 4" squares that are machine embroidered. Shirley Cronin (a DCQG member) completed the embroidery work on all the squares but did not get the quilt assembled before her passing. Rob Stoll was given a bag containing the squares and asked to complete the quilt. During this process, Rob learned that the design is from Hoopsisters (https://www.hoopsisters.com/). While consulting Hoopsisters, Rob assembled the quilt and quilted it (NOT an easy task—thank you Rob). The quilting is quite simple because of all the machine embroidery work within each square. The colors in the quilt are gorgeous. The quilt is very heavy due to all the thread. It will make a GREAT quilt for someone!!!

HARVEST OF QUILTS - NICU QUILTS

Our Goal is to create 50 NICU Quilts by guild's salad supper 2025. During the Quilt Show weekend, we will have a Demonstration room prepped for anyone to come in and participate in this project. The demonstration will be Quilt-as-you-go (QAYG) methods to show the ease of simple and fast sewing tasks. There will be opportunities for participants to prepare the initial 'sandwich' with a back and batting. Another station will have kits prepared with coordinating precut fabric strips. We will then have 2-4 stations for straight sewing of the attachment of strips to the batting in the QAYG technique. Another 2 stations will demonstrate two binding methods. These will include strip binding and fold over binding. And finally there will be a display station for the finished quilts.

Each finished NICU quilt will be approximately 47x54 inches. This size allows for the bassinet to be covered and creates a cozy space for baby. It also allows parents to easily find their little one if bassinets move around in the NICU. The quilt will go home with the family. We will include our DCQG label on each quilt. The tops will include multiple color fabrics in horizontal, vertical, or diagonal strips. As donations come in, we will get together to prep our materials before the show. Watch for working dates in the upcoming newsletters and on Facebook.

In order to reach our goal of 50 quilts, we are requesting donations of fabric, batting and notions. Below is a list of the items we are seeking to achieve our goal.

- Cotton or Flannel fabric (these can be large pieces or scraps. Minimum width 1 1/2 inches. We need this fabric for backs and tops. Each quilt takes approximately 3 yards of fabric)
- Cotton batting (long scraps from former projects are acceptable)
- Thread and bobbins
- Leftover binding strips
- Sewing machines to share
- Volunteers to help prep before the show
- Volunteers to sew in the demo room during the show

MEMORIES...AND A VOLUNTEER REQUEST

If my math is correct, the DeKalb County Quilters Guild was founded in 1979. In addition to teaching English and raising three children, my mom, Kathy Wells, was a guild member for many of those years. If you were lucky enough to see Mom's trunk show at the June 2022 meeting, you got to hear her beautifully written speech detailing how she came to love quilting and got to see many of her treasured quilts.

I was introduced to quilting by Mom and made my first quilt at 7 when my sister was born. As a teenager, I was lucky enough to participate in guild events with my mom. I remember workshops on Cathedral Window and Batik Dying, as well as bus trips to Shipshewana. It was a lot of fun, but I was never a member. Until 2018.

That year, the guild was looking for someone to take over the newsletter. Mom was a fantastic writer! I told her she'd be perfect in that role, and said I'd join the guild and help out as needed. Mom wrote many newsletter pieces over the years, but as it turns out the bulk of the job is just waiting for board members to email you their contributions so you can format it into a document to share with everyone. That's where I came in. Mom wrote, I formatted. We've done

this for six years now. This month, for the first time, I do it alone. As many of you know, Mom began dialysis in October, fighting hard, and ending that fight on April 15th. When Mom retired from teaching in 2011, she dove back into quilting. She was amazingly productive, and we have a treasure trove of completed projects from which to remember her. She loved Jenny Doan and was often starting this week's free tutorial because she couldn't resist a new pattern, so we have plenty of unfinished projects to complete too. Up to the very end, Mom told us how happy she was knowing we wouldn't get rid of her incomplete projects or fabric stash...that we would love

them and use them! And that we will! Even her Granddaughter Gemma is eager to make something for our upcoming quilt show.

Since the COVID lockdowns, when I moved in with Mom, she was my constant companion and best friend, as many of you can attest to. The only good thing that came of COVID...more time with Mom. I miss her dearly.

Having held this position with Mom for 6 years, I am ready to pass it on to someone else. If you have access to MS Word or Google Docs, and you can step up, please let the board know. I'd be happy to work with the new editor to show you how easy it is...just a couple of hours a month between the Zoom board meeting and the newsletter build. Or you could revamp it and make it your own! Please thoughtfully consider this position, that generally is a 2 year post. I would love to pass it on to a new editor.
