
# **HOLIDAY DINNER**

# **HARVEST OF QUILTS RECAP**



# **WAYS AND MEANS**

From Kathi Davis, VP of Ways & Means, Quilt Show Publicity --- Now that the quilt show was successful and the raffle quilt was won, it's time to move on to the next raffle quilt, the one for 2026. Remember when we voted for the quilt design we wanted to do? The winner was Ribbon Star from Missouri Star.

It's made completely from 2 ½ inch strips. I will use the AccuQuilt Go fabric cutter (owned by



the guild, contact me to use) to cut all the strips needed. I gathered fabric from the sales that Pat Boeche and Anita Hyde held this year. I will be making up kits, one per block, including instructions. They will have them available at the Christmas party on December 5th. Yes, I know we are all busy before Christmas, but our next meeting after the Christmas party is not until January 23<sup>rd</sup>. I'm figuring that you might have a "lull" of things to do after the holidays and then can make a block or two—at least I hope so.

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## ... Ways and Means continued

I'm hoping we can have the blocks done by the February meeting so that the quilt top can be assembled shortly thereafter. The goal is to have it completed no later than September 2025. We can only start selling raffle tickets one year prior to the quilt being raffled as per the permit we must obtain. So, this is a reasonable time frame. Please see me to pick up a block or two or three...at the Christmas party. Thanks to everyone in advance. And we will be holding dates, probably the Sew-In Saturdays, in the spring to complete the top.

FYI: I decided, due to the quilt show this year with members making things to show and sell, to postpone the making of the 2025 quilt until after. Thus, the delay in continuing from when we voted on the pattern.

From Linda Parker – We had a wonderful time in the Demonstration room with the NICU quilts using QAYG (Quilt as you go). THANK YOU to Madaline Carpenter for the inspiration. Allow us to share our gratitude to each contributor or fabric, time, and improvement ideas which made this project launch successfully.

Starting on setup night (Thursday) – Setup of the room went smooth. Laura Wall brought 3 lovely Singer workhorse machines. Joann Russell setup her workstation including choice of a pink stripe kit – ready for all the action!

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## ... Generosity Project continued

Moria and Joann started the demos early with glue basting the back to the batting. It then dried overnight and was ready for Friday morning. Thank you to Krista Urban for the first 3 quilts added to our Welcome display. I also included 2 quilts for a total of 5 completed quilts.

During the show, Joann arrived ready to start her first quilt in two years. She showed her professional expertise from the very beginning. We had every machine humming all day with a steady group of sewers. It was fun to hang out with Kim Colness, Krista Urban, Marge Garbo, Donna Martin, and Laura Wall. Moria provided the explanation of QAYG and demonstration of glue basting for each guest. It was a treat to see so many fans of Joann stop by to share fellowship time together. Pat Barger added comic relief throughout the weekend by giving some razzing, as needed. Laughter and 'cutting up' was shared throughout the day. We completed 2 additional quilts and sent home 4 kits. Making our total so far – 11 quilts 'almost' done.
